

**DRAFT MEETING MINUTES OF THE  
BERNALILLO COUNTY CRIMINAL JUSTICE COORDINATING COUNCIL**

**I. Introductions and Announcements**

The meeting was called to order by Artie Pepin, chair of the BCCJCC, at 2:00 pm. A quorum of members was present.

Judge Benavidez moved approval of the agenda for the meeting. Judge Nash seconded the motion. Agenda for October 19, 2017 meeting was approved.

**II. New and Ongoing Activities**

**A. Minutes**

Judge Nash moved approval of the minutes from the October 3, 2017 meeting. DA Torrez seconded the motion. The minutes from the October 3, 2017 were approved.

**B. Review Bylaws.** Mr. Pepin had four copies of the final approved bylaws and asked all BCCJCC voting members to sign.

**C. Report on Supreme Court CMO Discussion.** Mr. Pepin met with the Supreme Court yesterday and wanted to share the court's appreciation for all of the hard work done on creating recommendations for improving the CMO. The Supreme Court did not take a vote on any of the proposed changes. Mr. Pepin would like to prepare a consolidated document that will track the DA, LOPD and SJDC's proposed changes to the CMO. Since the DA and LOPD's versions are so different, this may require more than one document. Mr. Pepin asked the commission members to submit any additional

comments or suggested changes to the CMO by Friday, November 3, and he will distribute this information to commission members for comment. November 10, 2017 will be the final deadline for all comments to be submitted to AOC.

There was discussion about the effective date for any Supreme Court approved changes. It was determined that a February 2018 effective date would be ideal since that would be consistent with the effective date of prior changes made to the CMO.

**D. Release Process.** This agenda item was tabled for discussion at the next meeting.

**E. Competency Process.** This agenda item was tabled for discussion at the next meeting.

**F. Integrated Data System.** There was discussion of convening a stakeholder's meeting later in the year to identify how data can be shared within the criminal justice system and the mental health system.

**G. I-Team Report.** Dr. Paul Guerin discussed the history of the I Team. Dr. Guerin indicated that data from APD, BCSO, MDC and DPS in Bernalillo County was combined to create data sets that could identify repeat offenders during the period of January 2010 to December 2016. The funding for this project ends in 2017 and the future of the I Team is uncertain.
