5	A RESOLUTION TO ADOPT THE NATIONAL ASSOCIATION OF COUNTIES
6 7	STEPPING UP INITIATIVE TO REDUCE THE NUMBER OF PEOPLE WITH
8	MENTAL ILLNESS IN THE METROPOLITAN DETENTION CENTER
9	WHEREAS, counties routinely provide treatment services to the estimated 2 million
10	people with serious mental illnesses booked into jail each year; and
11	WHEREAS, prevalence rates of serious mental illnesses in jails are three to six times
12	higher than for the general population; and
13	WHEREAS, almost three-quarters of adults with serious mental illnesses in jails have
14	co-occurring substance use disorders; and
15	WHEREAS, adults with mental illnesses tend to stay longer in jail and upon release are
16	at a higher risk of recidivism than people without these disorders; and
17	WHEREAS, county jails spend two to three times more on adults with mental illnesses
18	that require interventions compared to those without these treatment needs; and
19	WHEREAS, without the appropriate treatment and services, people with mental illnesse
20	continue to cycle through the criminal justice system, often resulting in tragic outcomes for these
21	individuals and their families; and
22	WHEREAS, Bernalillo County takes seriously its responsibility to protect and enhance
23	the health, welfare and safety of its residents in efficient and cost-effective ways; and
24	WHEREAS, Bernalillo County has an obligation to protect the health and safety of
25	Metropolitan Detention Center (MDC) corrections staff and inmates; and

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26	WHEREAS, the population at MDC has dropped significantly over the past 18 months
27	through initiatives developed by Bernalillo County and its partners in the criminal justice system;
28	and
29	WHEREAS, MDC has begun implementing a pilot program to enroll inmates in New
30	Mexico's Medicaid system; and
31	WHEREAS, Bernalillo County has allocated \$1 million to create 70 supportive housing
32	units for individuals who are incarcerated but eligible for release and who have been identified as
33	having a mental illness, substance abuse or co-occurring disorders, and are homeless or
34	precariously housed, and to connect this vulnerable population with resources and services that
35	promote stability and prevent recidivism; and
36	WHEREAS, the Bernalillo County Commission has implemented a 1/8 cent gross
37	receipts tax to expand access to behavioral health services; and
38	WHEREAS, Bernalillo County has engaged a consultant to advise the County
39	Commission on the development of a behavioral health "business plan", to include strategies for
40	alternatives to incarceration for residents with behavioral health disorders; and
41	$\mathbf{WHEREAS}$, through $\mathit{Stepping}\ \mathit{Up}$, the National Association of Counties, the Council of
42	State Governments Justice Center and the American Psychiatric Foundation are encouraging
43	public, private and nonprofit partners to reduce the number of people with mental illnesses in
44	jails;
45	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Bernalillo County Board of County
46	Commissioners does hereby commit to continuing efforts to reduce the number of people with
47	mental illnesses in the MDC; commit to sharing lessons learned with other counties in New
48	Mexico and across the country to support a national initiative and encourage all county officials,

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employees and residents to participate in <i>Stepping Up</i> . We resolve to utilize the comprehensive

1.	. Convene or draw on a diverse team of	f leaders and decision makers from multiple	
	agencies committed to safely reducing	g the number of people with mental illnesses in jail	
2. Collect and review prevalence numbers and assess individuals' needs to better identify			
	adults entering jails with mental illnes	sses and their recidivism risk, and use that baseline	
	information to guide decision making	at the system, program, and case levels.	
3. Examine treatment and service capacity to determine which programs and service			
	available in the county for people with	h mental illnesses and co-occurring substance use	
	disorders, and identify state and local	policy and funding barriers to minimizing contact	
	with the justice system and providing	treatment and supports in the community.	
4. Develop a plan with measurable outcomes that draws on the jail assessment and			
prevalence data and the examination of available treatment and service capacity, while			
considering identified barriers.			
5. Implement research-based approaches that advance the plan.			
6. Create a process to track progress using data and information systems, and to report on			
	successes.
